Pompey

67 BC: Marries Pompeia, the daughter of his ally Pompey

60–59 BC: Elected consul; marries Calpurnia; forms First Triumvirate

55 BC: Defeats Germanic tribes that invade Gaul; invades Britain

54 BC: Daughter Julia, who was married to Pompey, dies

53 BC: Crassus defeated in battle and killed

44 BC: Ides of March assassination

83–82 BC: Sulla gains control of Rome

84 BC: Father dies; marries Cornelia

100 BC: Julius Caesar is born

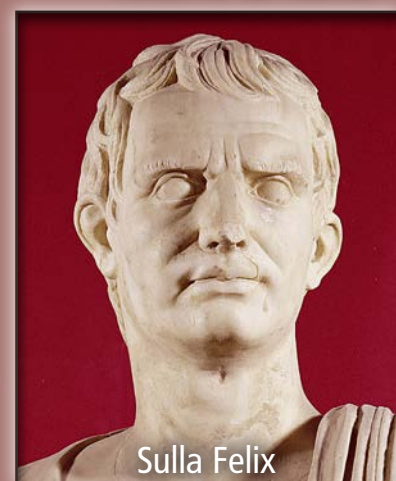

69 BC: Cornelia dies

73 BC: Elected Pontifex

63 BC: Elected Pontifex Maximus

62 BC: Divorces Pompeia following Bona Dea scam

61 BC: Appointed governor of Farther Spain

58 BC: Becomes governor of Cisalpine and Transalpine Gaul; defeats Germanic tribes

52 BC: Caesar suppresses rebel Gaul uprising

49 BC: Crosses the Rubicon; civil war begins
