11. Students should make reference to the fact that Gandhi was born into a Hindu family and that many Hindu people believe in nonviolence and showing respect for others. Students may also reference the fact that both of Gandhi's parents were kind and compassionate people; his mother cared for the sick and poor, and his father helped to settle disputes between the local people and the British.
12. Students' answers will vary but should include the following ideas: *Gandhi's family was Hindu and believed strongly in nonviolence. Gandhi also learned respect for others and their beliefs from his father. By nonviolent protest, Gandhi was able to stay within his own beliefs while not harming others and still make a point about how unfair he viewed certain laws to be.*
